The EAACI Annual Congress 2019 promises once again to be the world's largest scientific event in the field of allergy and clinical immunology, providing a unique educational and learning experience for both clinical practitioners and researchers in the field.
We look forward to meeting you all in Lisbon in June.



On Tuesday 4 June, the focus of the plenary symposium will be on the links between allergy and the **microbiome** and the current concepts and targets for controlling allergic diseases. One of the plenary sessions will provide a thorough overview of the gut microbiome from Susan Lynch (Division of Gastroenterology, University of California, San Francisco, USA) and of the lung microbiome from David Denning (School of Biological Sciences, University of Manchester, UK) and their association with the pathogenesis of allergy and asthma. In a parallel session, current concepts and approaches to **target barriers, mediators and tolerance** in the control of allergic disorders will be addressed, respectively by Carme Aude-Gisbert (Institute of Allergy and Asthma Research, Davos, Switzerland), Ioana Agache (Transylvania University, Brasov, Romania) and Tari Haahtela (Skin and Allergy Hospital, Helsinki University Central Hospital, Finland).

Finally, **on Wednesday 5 June**, the plenary session will be held in memory of Anthony J. Freese and is entitled **Allergen Immunotherapy (AIT): Conceptualising the future and beyond**. In this plenary, recent evidence on current novel approaches to allergen immunotherapy will be outlined by Stephen Durham (National Heart & Lung Institute, Imperial College London, United Kingdom). Ongoing EAACI efforts at improving clinical trial designs in the era of evidence-based medicine will be highlighted by Oliver Pfarr (Department of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, University Hospital, Mannheim, Germany) and gaps in evidence and future priorities in allergen immunotherapy will be discussed by Marek Jutel (Medycyny Instytut Badawczy, Wrocław, Poland).



There are only 6 weeks to go before the EAACI Congress 2019 and it is our great joy to announce that the event will be held in Lisbon (Portugal) from 4-9 June. This year, we have a top-level scientific programme developed by a dedicated Scientific Programme Committee, based on the high-quality proposal of our global EAACI Membership. Sections, Interest Groups and Working Groups will provide a world of allergy and clinical immunology. In line with the Congress theme, topics cover allergen structures, aerobiology, disease endotypes, biologics, as well as mapping and metabolomics, all of which are today's tools for a better understanding of allergic disorders, driving both basic science and clinical practice towards precision medicine care.

With an exciting and high-quality programme that this year encompasses more than 5000 abstracts, we are pleased to give you a few brief highlights of the plenary symposia and keynote speakers in Lisbon during the EAACI Congress 2019.

On Sunday 2 June, a plenary symposium will focus on new concepts in **food allergy**, in which Marc Veldhoen (Instituto de Medicina Molecular, Lisbon, Portugal) will present an overview of the role of T cells in gut and mucosal immune tolerance. Harald Renz (Institute of Laboratory Medicine, Philipps University Marburg, Germany) will focus on the relevance of exposure and food allergy, and Karl Christian Nadeau (Sean N. Parker Center for Allergy and Asthma Research, Stanford University, USA) will highlight the current and future treatment directions in food allergy. A parallel symposium will address new insights in **skin hypersensitivity** providing an update on the pathophysiology links of the epidermal barrier and skin immune imbalance addressed by Thomas Bieber (Department of Dermatology and Allergy, University of Bonn, Germany), and on the microbiome impact in atopic dermatitis by Martin Glaz (Department of Dermatology, University Hospital of Zürich, Switzerland), new treatments in the pipeline will be covered by Kilian Eyerich (Department of Dermatology and Allergy, Technical University of

On Monday 3 June, a Plenary address will address the therapeutic effect of currently available large molecule biologics in the treatment of severe asthma, small molecules, potential of treatment response and to be addressed. The clinical approach and treatment type 2 asthma will be covered by Nair McMaster (University of Toronto, Canada) and current and future biological children with asthma will be addressed by Just (Hopital Armand-Trousseau, Paris, France). Similarly, new concepts on strategies can target cellular in T cells will be presented by University Foundation San while their clinical application immunotherapy of immunology will be addressed by Mihai (Institute of Allergy and Asthma, Switzerland).
